Be Centre ten years on

Ten years ago Be Centre started with one room and one Play Therapist.

The philosophy was to see what the community wanted, to see if there was a need for our service. Well, over the years we've seen that there is a clear and increasing need and it's immensely exciting for me, as the founder, to see how Be Centre has grown and blossomed in response. We're now reaching so many more people – a really broad spectrum of the community – and our new purpose-built facility is enabling us to reach even more.

We've had a great deal of help to get to where we are now and I'd particularly like to thank everyone who contributed so much and worked so hard to establish our new centre – FDC for the wonderful design and fitout, the organisations and people from our local community who helped so generously, our cherished volunteers, our dedicated Board and our amazing team, including Marisa Chilcott our executive director, Gailene Keen our fundraising and development manager and Fiona Howell our clinical manager. The collective input and energy of all those involved has resulted in a fantastic facility for our next stage of growth.

This year we welcome Mark Lollback to the Board and look forward to his expertise in business strategy really enhancing our team. This appointment is the latest step in broadening and increasing the capability of the Board to meet the challenges of growth and sustainability for Be Centre.

Play Therapy is one of the most effective forms of therapy for children. Our statistical analysis demonstrates that Play Therapy at Be Centre benefits the vast majority of the children who attend. One of our aims is to keep raising awareness within the education, medical and broader communities about the value and effectiveness of Play Therapy. Now that we have our purpose-built headquarters, we are continuing to work with our current partners and building relationships with new partners to expand the capacity of Be Centre to help more children.

A big plan for the future is to work within the education system to establish Play Therapy rooms in schools to support children at the local level. Offering Play Therapy in a school environment would improve accessibility and have a terrific amount of positive impact. This is a model which has been widely used and proven in the UK over a number of years and we aim to pioneer this in Australia.

Be Centre has come a long way in ten years and we have so much more to do. We welcome your collaboration and support to help create great results going forward.

A big year for Be Centre!



Moving to our fantastic new premises has positioned us for real growth, capacity-building and exciting possibilities for the future.

Our new facilities are already allowing us to assist more children, employ more staff and deliver our services in a well designed environment that is conducive to achieving great outcomes for the families we support. We now have additional Play Therapy rooms, rooms for parent/carer interviews and counselling, a larger space for our holiday programs which help children transition to and from therapy and a place for families to enjoy some quiet time while the child is in their session. We couldn't have achieved all this without our partners and the community – FDC who facilitated the design and fitout, The Charitable Foundation who once again supported us very generously and community organisations and individuals who together contributed at least half a million dollars of donated goods and services. I'm grateful for the support of our Board who backed the idea, got involved in fundraising and took a leap of faith so that Be Centre can enter this next phase of development. I'd also like to thank the Be Centre team for their professionalism, commitment and hard work.

This year we've continued to work with our partners to develop and expand Be Centre's services. With the Benevolent Society and Royal Far West Manly we continue to work to extend our reach, including new intensive programs for children from rural areas and we're developing new partnerships with organisations that support families in crisis. We recently presented at the Australian Pacific Play Therapy Association conference the results from our Aboriginal program which has been developed in partnership with the Glebe TreeHouse, Deakin University and Weave. The support of the local Aboriginal community, our Aboriginal Community Connect worker Linda Williams and our partners has been vital to the success of the program and we look forward to developing it further. Our aim is to foster productive professional relationships to help us grow sustainably and provide more opportunities to help children in need.

We are committed to developing new ways to support families and children wholistically. This year we researched and produced an extensive social impact report on our programs that has given us useful insight into the community we are part of, how our services support children and families and how we can serve them more effectively. To help improve outcomes for the children, we've been developing our support for families as a whole, including counselling and skill building for parents/carers and continuing with our fantastic Tuning in to Kids and Tuning in to Teens programs. We have achieved NDIS registration for 7–11 year olds, allowing us to improve accessibility, and we continue to assess the long term outcomes of our programs through our bi-annual family survey which follows up six to twelve months after a child has finished therapy.

We've achieved a big dream this year with our new premises and our dream now is to keep building the capacity we've created. We are looking for help with this and there are many opportunities for people to get involved including volunteering, contributing goods and services that we can include in our fundraising and marketing activities and supporting our fundraising efforts by making donations and of course by attending our annual Gala Dinner.

Once again we are so grateful for the continued and generous support which enables us to help more children each year. We couldn't do it without you.

What we do

Be Centre is a leading mental health charity providing Play Therapy for children aged 3–12 years. We are dedicated to early intervention, stopping cycles of harm and helping children heal from difficulties and trauma. We do this by:

Supporting children

- one-to-one Play Therapy aimed at improving emotional wellbeing, building resilience and helping them develop tools to cope with life's challenges
- imaginative small group holiday workshops for clients and the community, which further support therapeutic aims including helping children improve social skills and creative expressions.

Supporting parents and carers

- recognising the crucial roles they play in the emotional wellbeing of their children
- offering skills programs to help them feel more at ease with their roles and better able to develop positive relationships with their children
- offering personal counselling through one-to-one and telephone sessions.

Supporting professionals

- expert advice and training to help them increase their confidence and skills so they can improve
 outcomes in their work with children
- an intern program for trainee Play Therapists
- clinical supervision for those working in therapeutic roles with children.

Quality assurance and outcome measures

- staff clinical supervision
- ongoing training and professional development for staff and volunteers
- regular evaluation of, and reporting on, Play Therapy outcomes
- partnerships with multiple agencies to nurture a helpful referral network.

Ben's story

Ben was six years old and very unhappy when his mum brought him to Be Centre after referral from a local welfare service.

For much of his life Ben had been exposed to domestic violence. Ben's dad abused alcohol and his behaviour frightened Ben. He often argued with Ben's mum – sometimes so loudly that the neighbours called the police – and Ben had seen him assault her, grabbing her around the throat.

Ben was scared that his dad might kill his mum, him or his little brother. Ben was confused because although he scared him, sometimes his dad was fun to be with. Ben worried that it might be his fault that his parents fought so much.

When his dad moved out Ben felt even more confused. He became clingy and didn't want to be away from his mum – sometimes feeling sick and not wanting to go to school. He would lash out at his mum and little brother, unable to regulate his strong emotions or to articulate what he was going through. Ben was having difficulties with friendships and with his school work. His teacher said it seemed like he was carrying a heavy weight on his shoulders.

Ben's mum struggled to cope with Ben's anger and felt she couldn't connect with him. She felt scared, guilty, worried and desperate when she was referred to Be Centre. She couldn't afford to pay for therapy and was relieved that Be Centre could provide services through its scholarship program.

At Be Centre, Ben's Play Therapist accepted him just as he was. She supported him to process his experiences, work through his feelings and learn new skills. She gave him time and space to do everything at his own pace. Gradually Ben was able to trust his play therapist and, within the safety of this relationship, played out his anger, fear and worries using puppets, role plays, sandplay and the bop bag. He began to feel the weight lift from his shoulders.

Be Centre also supported Ben's mum to reconnect with him and helped her to understand the influence of trauma on his behaviour.

Slowly but surely Ben was able to move through his anxiety and fears. He learned that his feelings were ok and that his parents fighting wasn't his fault. He started to develop a new sense of self and to smile, have fun and be a kid again.

Ben was able to leave therapy with a sense of hope and has continued to improve in his interactions at home and at school. Ben's mum reported that the family is much happier and more connected after Be Centre's support.



Our new HQ

In March 2017 Be Centre moved into amazing new premises in Warriewood.

With demand for our services increasing, Be Centre had outgrown our original space and had a waitlist of 100+ children. Now we are set for growth with more than double our previous clinical capacity and dedicated spaces for parent support, holiday programs, administration and training.

The space presented considerable challenges for us as a small charity – it was just a shell and needed a major fitout to bring it to life and provide the specialist facilities we required. We were extremely lucky to have the support of FDC Construction & Fitout who enthusiastically came on board to help make our vision a reality. Con, Ashley, Jonathan and the team are true professionals who worked tirelessly. As well as donating a large proportion of their services they arranged for their suppliers

and contacts to help with greatly reduced rates or donations, including interior designer Leigh Holt who created a wonderful aesthetic in response to our brief for a safe and welcoming environment, Steve Watson & Partners who managed the building certification process and Skaffad Australia who produced the wall decals and signage, transforming the space.

The Be Centre fundraising team was overwhelmed by the generosity of the companies and individuals who together contributed well over \$300,000 of the best quality goods and services. We are also grateful for the financial support of CLSA Chairman's Trust, Dick Smith, Profield Foundation, Rotary Club of Upper Northern Beaches, Sargents Pies Charitable Foundation, St George Foundation and The Charitable Foundation. We also appreciate our wonderful volunteers, so important to the running of Be Centre, who worked energetically over several weekends to help us clean and complete the move.

The new facility was opened on 19 May 2017 by The Hon Rob Stokes MP, Member for Pittwater, and Mr Jason Falinski MP, Member for Mackellar, at a well attended celebration breakfast.




The new colour palette has been designed to evoke a feeling of strength, hope, freshness and growth.
















Creativity and community

Be Centre's art programs foster therapeutic goals and skill-building in a small group environment.

Creative expression is one of the many tools for healing that children can use in Play Therapy. To extend the benefits that children gain from their one-on-one Play Therapy sessions, Be Centre runs a very popular series of imaginative holiday workshops and will trial a new Art Club in 2018.

Karen Atkins, an artist with a strong background in developing and facilitating art programs with children and young people, has worked with Be Centre to create the holiday workshops and Art Club, "These programs provide opportunities for children to develop their artistic skills and to enjoy ongoing materials exploration in a small group environment," she says, "As both a means of communication and an invaluable component of a child's learning and development, creative expression helps children improve their fine motor skills, learn to solve problems, develop resilience in the face of challenges and gain a sense of accomplishment and confidence."

"I envisage our sessions as a place of fun, safety and creativity where everyone feels free to voice ideas and manifest their visions and dreams" Visual art is one of the main components of the holiday programs. Facilitated by Karen, children can enjoy a sensory art workshop and an art masterclass.

"In the sensory session the children explore materials, their reactions to them and ways in which they can interact with them," Karen says. "Each session is designed to elicit responses from all the senses and the children are free to explore the materials in accordance with their own needs and wishes." And things can get messy!

"It is enormously exhilarating and fun," she laughs, "We might be creating an indoor snow storm, making foam or concocting slimy brews of gloop!"

The masterclass offers a different experience, focusing on renowned artists and their techniques. "We discuss the artist's work and our responses to it, then concentrate on some technical skills such as brushwork or colour mixing and create our own versions." explains Karen. "Children explore a range of materials that offer them a rich and varied experience and they have produced some really amazing works". Be Centre is grateful to our generous supporters who donate the art materials and assist in the workshops.

Art Club, made possible by a generous grant from UnLtd and facilitated by Karen, is being developed as a way for children to practice and strengthen the skills they have learned in their Play Therapy sessions. Open only to children who are clients of Be Centre, Art Club will offer a unique small-group situation for those who need additional support to transition out of therapy with confidence and is already showing promising results.

"The holiday workshops and Art Club offer an opportunity to play, create, explore and invent in a group situation, learning from one another and sharing reactions to the events we create," Karen enthuses, "I envisage our sessions as a place of fun, safety and creativity where everyone feels free to voice ideas and manifest their visions and dreams."

I first heard of Be Centre when I attended the Annual Fundraiser in August 2016.








Finances


